



What to expect from an interview as part of the application for Higher Education Courses

We require applicants to complete an online video interview during the application process for higher education courses. Interviews are to assess the applicant's readiness for the course they are enrolling for.

Interviews are not a test! There are no right or wrong answers.

What is the aim of the interview?

Interviews give the applicant an opportunity to explain about their academic and career goals. They will have the chance to speak with staff who will be supporting them through the course, so that they can discuss strength, interests and any questions they may have before starting.

The main aim of the interview is to ensure the applicant is confident that the course they are enrolling for is the right choice for their current knowledge, abilities and career progress.

What language are interviews conducted in?

Interviews are conducted in English, because the applicant will learn course content and produce assessment work in English throughout the course. All Higher Education courses are delivered in English. UK Awarding Bodies require learners to submit assessment work in English only.

Who are interviews with?

Generally, interviews will be with two members of Frisby College staff:

1. Course Coordinator – The course tutor and support person in Thailand who will have weekly contact with the learner.
2. Course Assessor – A member of Frisby College's Assessment Team who will validate the learner's work and progress throughout the course.

Both people are English Speakers. Our team is friendly and passionate about supporting international learners.

How can you prepare for an interview?

Very little preparation is needed for interviews because we aim for the experience to be informal and as natural as possible. Applicants can however think ahead about how they would like to introduce themselves and explain about their future career plans and interests in business and management.

Topics applicants might want to talk about:

- Previous experiences in business, employment or study.
- Career plans and goals
- Areas of interest in business and management
